

This resource provides a qualification to empower and support VET professionals to use the European tools of EQF-ECVET-EQAVET in order to modernise and improve their level of quality, excellence and attractiveness in their organisation. This output is outcome-oriented in order to strengthen the link between the curriculum and work requirements of VET professionals and provides an interdisciplinary approach and the necessary basis for the development of the following output "O4 - Attract-VET Training Programme".
